# Respect and Responsibility

Over recent years, since the pandemic and resulting school closures, we have noticed a steady decline in the behaviour of some of our pupils. This is a national trend as outlined in the OFSTED annual report "Since the pandemic, pupils and teachers are seeing more disruptive behaviour in school. This is affecting both their experience of school and their ability to learn or teach. This is especially true of persistent low-level disruption in class, such as pupils refusing to do as they are told, talking back to teachers ...."

Whilst it is reassuring that we are not alone in what we are observing at Barlby Community Primary School with regards to behaviour, we are not willing to allow this trend to continue. Over the last term, staff have been working hard to start the journey that will make a positive difference for our pupils.

All staff at school have been involved in reviewing the behaviour of our pupils as it is now, the behaviour standard we would like it to return to and the journey we need to go on to help the children achieve this standard.

We strongly believe Barlby Community Primary School is a place to learn and grow. As such, running alongside the academic teaching, we will teach the children about appropriate behaviours acceptable in school as well as wider behaviours they will need in various situations in life. Each day, we will teach dedicated lessons to the whole school around behaviour expectations. Examples of the weekly behaviour focus' include; honesty, punctuality, manners, resilience, including everyone, dignity, personal space, and learning from mistakes. We will focus all these expectations around **Respect and Responsibility**. We have, over the term, reviewed our current behaviour policy (this can be found on the school website) and prepared to make the changes outlined in this newsletter. Please take the time to talk to your children about the changes (detailed overleaf), the consequences that will need to be faced for wrong choices and the rewards they will be given for making the right choices.

We aim to celebrate the success of the many children in school that continuously behave impeccably through the introduction of Golden Time each Friday.

Any questions, concerns or comments can be made to Mrs Baker, class teachers, the pastoral team or leadership team at Open Evening on Monday  $18^{th}$  December 3.30-4.30pm, when you are invited to come and view your child's Assertive Mentoring (white folder).

Kind Regards, Jillian Baker Headteacher From Monday 8<sup>th</sup> January there will be a whole school briefing each Monday morning led by Mrs Baker or a member of the Senior Leadership Team. At the briefings the children will be told the behaviour focus of the week and reminded of past behaviours we have focused on.

In each class there will be a traffic light system with the children's names on. The children will start at Green for every session. Wrong choices and poor attitude to learning will see them move to Orange and then to Red if behaviour does not improve.

If a child is moved to Orange on the Traffic Light System they will miss all or part of a break time. During this time, they will talk to an adult about their choices, complete missed work or complete other written exercises.

If a child's behaviour is considered
Orange whilst eating, they will be
moved within the hall to a table
away from their peers. Outside
the child will be given time out
from play for 10 minutes.

Parents will be informed.

If a child is moved to Red on the Traffic Light System the leadership team will be requested to come and support behaviour and 5 minutes of Golden Time will be deducted. Parents will be informed.

Each week the children will start with 40 minutes Golden Time that will take place each Friday afternoon. Children will lose Golden Time in 5-minute chunks if wrong choices are made and they have been moved to 'Red' on their class behaviour chart or for behaviours that are not acceptable during break / lunch times.

Golden Time will be activities of the class' choice. This will be agreed with their class teacher each Monday.

Tuesday - Friday morning the children will spend 30 minutes each day learning about the behaviour focus for that week. This may be a role play activity, discussion, game, paper exercise etc

Children that are struggling with the same behaviours consistently will be offered THRIVE intervention or Pastoral Support. This will be in agreement with parents.

During each week children will still be rewarded stamps for behaviour, attitude to learning, manners, effort and attitude.

These stamps build up to Bronze, Silver and Gold certificates. Worker of the week will be awarded to each class and attendance awards will continue.
