A huge thank you to the school community for your continued support and patience whilst the build and alterations continue. We appreciate the frustrations you are experiencing with limited access to the school site, limited parking and the narrow gate and pathway, but we are doing our very best to manage the situation. It has been suggested to us, that the one way system be reintroduced (from COVID), but unfortunately there is no access around the back of the school, due to works in that area both underway and further works planned. We have also received a complaint about the puddle at the gate, again this is not something we can change. The pavement is the responsibility of North Yorkshire Highways and the issue has been highlighted to them. The works should be fully completed by September 2024 and we hope that you will understand that they are much needed to ensure we can continue to offer the highest level of education to your children.

The new behaviour policy introduced in January is working well, and we have seen an improvement in the general behaviour around school. The children have had a weekly focus on manners, honesty, respect, resilience, responsibility, compassion and rights of others to learn. Bridging the generation gap

Staff at Abbey Lea Care Home in Barlby have reflected back on what continues to be a "wonderful" intergenerational project with Barlby Community Primary School.

Barlby schoolteachers connected with the care home in 2023, and have since visited the site with pupils once a week to read, draw pictures and spend quality time with residents.

Along with sharing Christmas cards with Abbey Lea's residents, the kind-hearted children at Barlby Primary decided to raise funds to purchase three 'Hug Dolls' to help soothe those in need last year.

The weighted dolls are specially designed to help bring comfort, connection and meaning to the lives of people in the advanced stages of dementia, and come with a music player, programmed to play the person's favoucite music, along with a simulated beating heart.

A representative for the school, Emma Coulson, said: "I had stumbled across the dolls online one day and thought they looked interesting.

"As one of our targets on our pupils wellbeing action plan is to develop links in our local community and develop the role of the pupil wellbeing ambassadors, I thought it would be a good idea to do some fundraising and buy the care home one of these.

"We were so pleased to be able to buy Abbey Lea three in the end!"

Abbey Lea Care Home's registered group manager, Natalie White added that the residents really enjoy interacting with children of all ages, including visits from local two-year-old Harley



and his mum.

She said: "When Harley, a little boy who visits the care home with his mum, comes to see residents, he engages really well and often entertains them by playing football and drawing pictures."

Harley's mum, Emma Carter added: "I am so proud of Harley for being so kind, caring and thoughtful.

Minor First Aid Reporting

We are implementing a new system to inform parents / carers of any minor first aid treatment your child has received at school following an accident.

These accidents are generally from trips and falls and result in a cold compress being given or a plaster applied.

From Monday 4th March you will receive a text message stating ' Your child **name** has received minor first aid treatment at school today.'

This text will be sent out after lunchtime break.

This text will not replace the usual Head Bump text messages and letters you receive. These will continue as normal.

For serious accidents we will contact parents / carers by telephone immediately.

We hope you agree this new system will improve school to home communication in this area.
