## TOGETHER WE ACHIEVE

As we near the end of the fourth week of term I am pleased to share with you some exciting news about the long-awaited extension to our school.

After 8 years of planning, meetings and at times disappointments it is looking very likely that the building work for our 4-classroom extension will begin in January 2024.

The plan is to build 4 new classrooms on what is now the 'bottom playground', extend the school hall and do some extensive alterations inside the original building to create small break out, support, meeting rooms. The staff car park as it is now will change into additional play area and the staff car park will move to the school field across the road from us.

Amongst the excitement of having builders and construction equipment on site, we are obviously expecting some disruption to the daily running of the school over the proposed 8-month build, although any internal works are planned for the long summer break in 2024. With this in mind and to help prepare for the disruption we will be making small changes to our break times now. Morning break will remain as is for now, with the children mixing together, an opportunity to play with friends and siblings across the key stages. Lunchtimes will see the changes. We will be separating the children into EYFS / KS1 play area on the 'top playground' and KS2 play area on the 'bottom playground'. The changes will take place next week, by making these changes now we are hoping we will be able to transition the children easily through the build, when play space will be limited for a time, as they will be familiar with separate play.

# Playtime snack Water bottles


Reception Class 2024 application window opens on Thursday 12<sup>th</sup> October 2023 and closes Monday 15<sup>th</sup> January 2024
